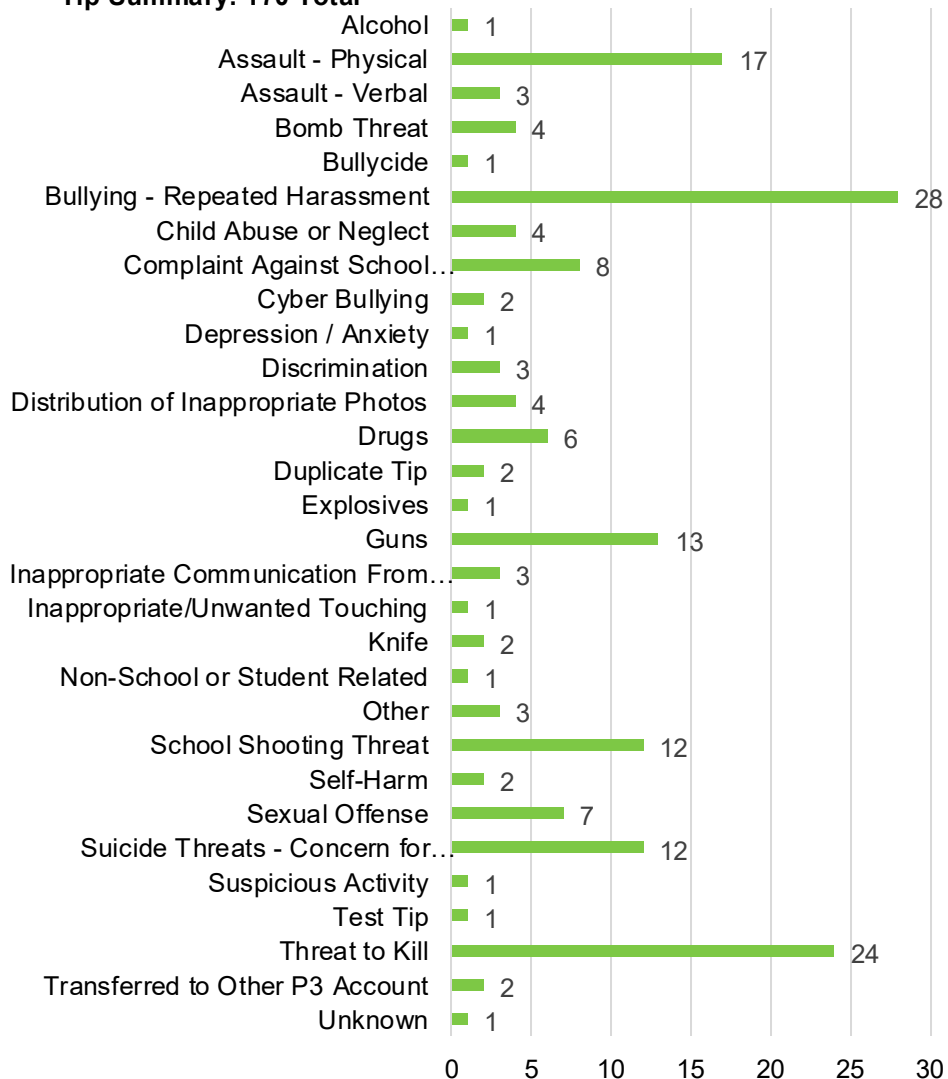

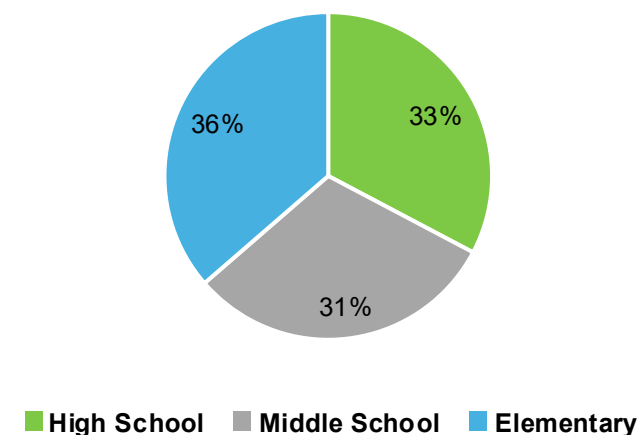

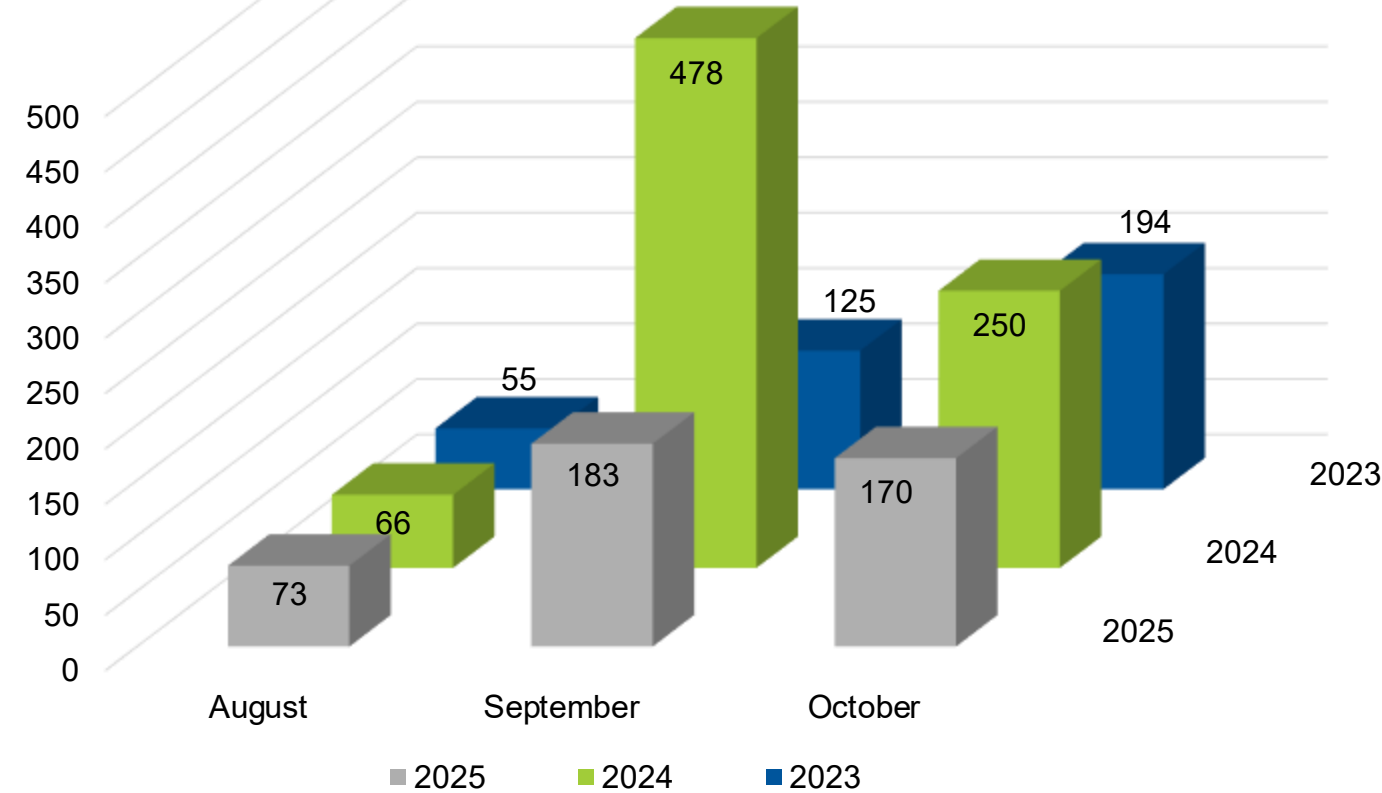
Life Safety Tips by School Level:



Courage2Report received a consistent number of tips in October, a figure comparable to September levels, though below previous years' volume. Bullying - Repeated Harassment remains the most frequently reported incident.

As we enter the holiday season it's important to remember holiday breaks can create real challenges for many students whose routines, support systems, and sense of safety come from school. Some youth face unstable or stressful home environments, increased responsibilities, financial pressures or even lack stable housing. Others experience "holiday blues", a temporary but significant dip in mood tied to loss, loneliness, routine changes, or family stress. These factors, combined with increased isolation and heightened online activity, can raise risks for anxiety, cyberbullying, unsafe online behavior, suicidal ideation and shifts in academic or behavioral performance.

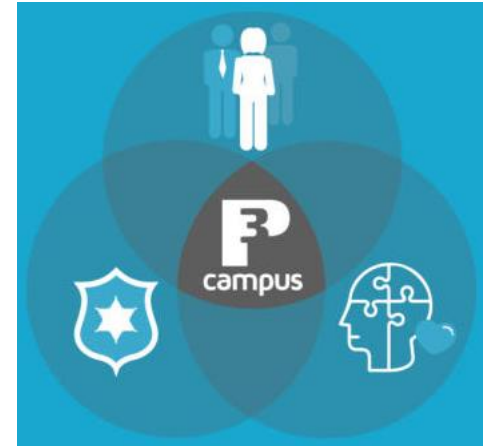
To support students, it's important for educators, families, and community partners to recognize signs of mental health concerns and create environments where students feel safe expressing their feelings. Schools can help by offering access to counselors, reducing unnecessary academic stress such as sending home holiday packets, and incorporating fun engaging lessons before breaks. Providing social emotional learning opportunities such as coping skills and stress management to students can further equip them to navigate holiday related challenges at home. Through shared awareness and coordinated support, adults can help protect youth wellbeing during these predictable high-risk timeframes.

P3 Campus Communication, Collaboration, Accountability

P3 Campus provides a secure, anonymous way for students, staff, parents and community members to report concerns via C2R's website and mobile app. P3 Campus also empowers bystanders to break the silence, facilitates real-time, two-way chats between the tipster and trained analysts, allows for 24/7 monitoring, and helps schools proactively address risks before they escalate, saving lives by getting crucial information to law enforcement and school officials quickly and confidentially.

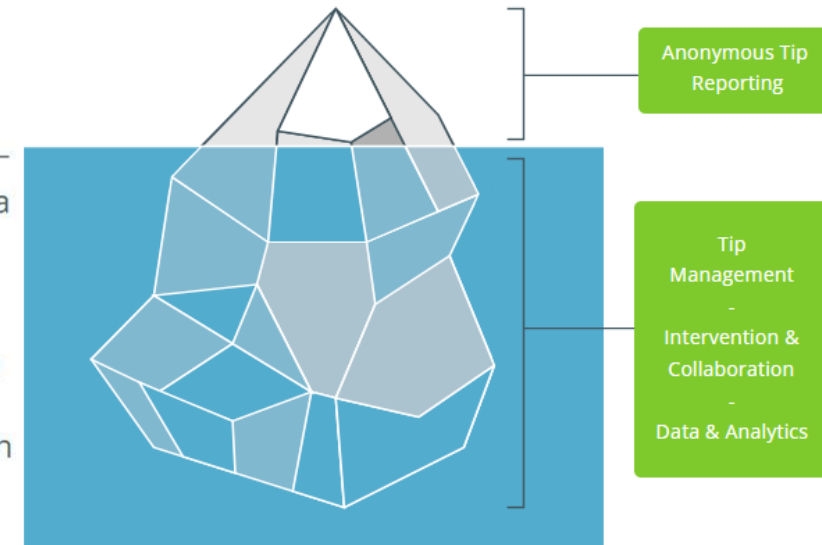
Key Reasons for Using P3 Campus:

- **Anonymity & Trust:** Eliminates fear of reprisal, encouraging more people to report concerns like bullying, drug / alcohol use, self-harm, or school shooting threats.
- **24/7 Monitoring & Response:** Offers round-the-clock coverage with trained staff and law enforcement for immediate action on life safety tips, even after school hours using our built-in contact list.
- **Real-Time Communication:** Allows for live, anonymous dialogue between tipsters and analysts, providing the opportunity to acquire additional information, including the ability to translate other languages.
- **Proactive Prevention:** Shifts focus from reacting to tragedies to intervening early, preventing harm by addressing root causes like depression or suicidal ideation.
- **Data & Trends:** Automatic checks for the same names, aliases, and addresses across all reports. Also provides dashboards to track keywords such as "kill" or "assault". This data helps to identify patterns and trends related to specific students or types of concerns, which aid in developing more effective, targeted violence prevention strategies.

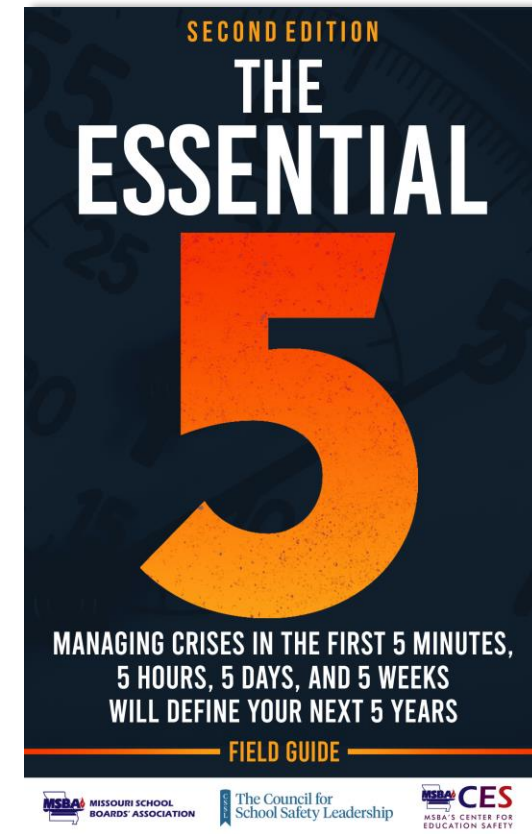

Handle With Care



In October, Courage2Report received and delivered **45** handle with care notifications to schools and law enforcement across the state.

Handle With Care Summary

- The notifications arrive at the school before the start of the next school day.
- No details are ever given.
- Notifications do not stay in the child's permanent records.
- Sets up schools to be proactive, rather than reactive.
- Can reduce disciplinary action and absenteeism while building resilience, self-respect, and confidence.
- Strengthens and improves relationships in the community.
- Reduces a child's risk of being inserted into the juvenile justice system for behaviors at school.
